

MIDDLE SCHOOL REPORT

I. Five-Year Discipline Intervention Profile (1st semester)

Each year at this time a first semester profile of student discipline is presented to the Board of Education. The information compares the first semester of the current school year with the first semester of the previous four school years. This year's information includes all discipline interventions through January 9, 2004.

Peacock maintains records of seven forms of discipline interventions. Listed below are these forms along with examples of behaviors that would qualify a student for the discipline intervention indicated. The examples are not intended to be an exhaustive list of infractions.

- **Thirty-minute detentions** – 3-5 tardys to school and/or to class, running in the hallways, taking food outside of the cafeteria.
- **One-hour detentions** – 6 and 7 tardys to school and/or to class, leaving class without permission, cheating, and bus disruptions with driver referral.
- **Two-hour detentions** – 8 and 9 tardys to school and/or class, exceeding three one-hour detentions, using vulgar and obscene language, minor vandalism to school property.
- **Four-hour detentions** – 10 and 11 tardys to school/class, exceeding three two-hour detentions, infractions that exceed the level of two-hour detentions.
- **Bus suspensions** – bus or bus stop infractions with driver referral that jeopardize the safety of students.
- **In-school suspensions** – tardys to school and/or class that exceed 11, exceeding three four-hour detentions, leaving school grounds without permission, cutting class, gross disrespect to school personnel, minor theft, misbehavior with substitute.
- **Out-of-school suspensions** – gang related gestures and language, use of tobacco, fighting, possession of drugs and drug paraphernalia, student-to-student harassment, gross insubordination.
- **Expulsions** – possession, consumption, or distribution of controlled substances that include look-alike drugs, willfully damaging or vandalizing school property, stealing or in possession of stolen school property, activating a fire alarm, making a bomb threat, possession of or setting off fireworks or other explosives.
