

## **MIDDLE SCHOOL REPORT**

### **I. Perception surveys**

With the school year rapidly coming to a close, perception surveys will be distributed to two important stakeholders at Peacock. On Friday, April 15<sup>th</sup> the parent survey of opinions will be distributed within each student's report card envelope. Parents will be asked to complete the document and send it back to school with their child inside the same report card envelope. The timing and the method of distribution have changed this year as a result of recommendations from Peacock's Parent Advisory Committee on how to improve upon the percentage of parents providing completed surveys. Student surveys will be completed during the school day in one of our extended advisor periods on Tuesday, May 17<sup>th</sup>. Survey results will be shared with the Board of Education and our families in September and with our staff at the August teacher institute days preceding the start of student attendance days for the 2005-06 school year.

### **II. Fine Arts Festival**

On Wednesday, April 20<sup>th</sup> the annual Fine Arts Festival will be held at Peacock. Student displays from our Encore programs as well as demonstrations from our Physical Education program will be available for our guests and highlight the first hour from 6-7pm. At 7pm students in our choral/choir program will provide a concert performance for everyone. Please note the change of date for the program reflected on our District 10 calendar. The event was originally scheduled for April 21<sup>st</sup> and due to a district wide conflict, changed to April 20<sup>th</sup>.

### **III. Musical production of *Good Man Charlie Brown***

Two performances of this year's musical of the production *You're A Good Man Charlie Brown* will take place on Thursday and Friday, May 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> from 7-9 pm in Peacock's gym. The production company, Schaumburg on Stage will once again organize the event with over 50 students from Peacock playing a role as either members of the cast or crew.

### **IV. Discipline Medication Committee**

The annually Discipline & Medication Committee will convene later this month on Monday, April 18, 2005. The committee consists of staff, administration, and members of the community including a representative of the Board of Education. A report of the committee's recommendations, if any, will be made to the Board of Education at their regular May meeting.
